The two areas of confusion we continue to see the most are: what number to call for Police Department help and what the basics of the trash contract allow. Please save this paper for future reference.

#### Message from the West Easton Police Department

Please be mindful of parking in the proper direction on all streets within the borough. Parking against traffic is problematic, especially when pulling out. It confuses drivers and is simply unsafe. We appreciate your help with making our streets safer.



Do not leave valuables or cash in your car. If you must leave items in the car, lock them out of sight.

With warm weather comes vacation time and potentially empty homes while you're away. Tell your trusted neighbors when you will be out of town. Watch over each other. If you would like your residence checked by our officers, we have created a Vacation/House Check form. The form will be kept in-house only, and officers will check the residence as often as possible. Hopefully, this helps our residents enjoy travel without the extra worry. Forms may be found on the borough website or picked up from the Police Station.

Our parks are busy again, and we love that. Be alert for children playing, walking, and riding bikes. We love our parks as much as the children do, but as a reminder, the parks do close at dusk.

Lastly, please keep your furry companions leashed and under control at all times and be a good neighbor (and follow the law) by cleaning up after your pets. This goes for the sidewalks and streets as well as your neighbors' yard, when passing by.

If you need a police officer, please do not call the Borough office phone number. Police officers should be dispatched via the Northampton County 911 Center. To report an emergency call 911; for non-emergencies call 610-759-2200. #### TRASH REMINDERS


Waste Collection - Trash is collected weekly on Monday. Residents may place a maximum of three (3) bags or two (2) cans of waste at the curb each week. Please bag all waste before placing in your container. Place all items at the curb no later than 6 a.m. on your collection day. Do NOT use 13-gallon bags or store bags as your trash bags. If animals get into your trash bags, it is your responsibility to clean up the mess, not the trash haulers.

<u>Bulk Item Collection</u> - One bulk item is allowed once a month, the first Monday of each month. Bulk items include: a mattress, box spring, chair, couch, appliance, etc. <u>Mattresses and box springs must be wrapped completely in plastic for pickup.</u>

<u>Construction debris</u> - Residents are permitted to dispose of one (1) container or one (1) bundle of debris each week. Construction debris must be able to be easily picked up by two persons, so please consider the size and weight of the debris. All nails and screws should be removed.

Recycling Collection - Recycling will be collected every other Monday. Place your acceptable recyclables directly into your recycling container – do not bag recyclables – and flatten all cardboard boxes to fit inside your recycling can. Please see the Borough website for acceptable recycling items and tips on *Recycling Right*. Residents were offered free blue recycling bins from the Borough office. Contact the Borough if you have not picked up your recycle bin, or get a red recycle sticker for your own container. Do not put regular trash or grass cuttings in your recycle bin.

Household Hazardous Wastes are NOT ACCEPTED. Toxic chemicals, pesticides, oil-based paints, automotive batteries, fuels or fluids must be disposed of properly.

Nothing should go into a storm drain except stormwater. Please pick up litter, debris or garbage from yard, sidewalks, driveways and other areas so that it is not washed into the storm drain. Pick up and properly dispose of pet waste. When you mow your lawn,

make sure the grass cuttings go back into your own lawn rather than out into the street or your neighbor's yard. Recycle or properly dispose of hazardous materials including paints, used oil and chemicals. If you see a storm drain with debris over it, please take the time to clear it off to prevent possible flooding.
